5. Curriculum

5.01 Curriculum Report – Joe Veger

Mr. Veger reviewed the SkillsUSA organization and said he would have officers from the high school and jr. high school. The car show fundraiser will be October 1. He is planning to build this into a Chapter of Excellence which requires a certain number of meetings, community

service and fundraisers during the year. Last year they received a grant from TechPoint which helped the middle school robotics team. Teams are six members and for Skills they are two member teams so that six would make three teams and they need to complete in at least one competition this year.

He mentioned that only vertical construction is taught at high schools and what is needed is horizontal construction, building roads, bridges, sidewalks. This type of construction (civil construction) is hungry for workers. Hamilton Heights and Griffith are the only schools in the state that offer this type of instruction. Mr. Veger is researching this and hopes to be able to bring it here.

At this point Ms. Quinn introduced Mrs. Jessica Surma who was approved on the Consent Agenda to be the corporation's nurse. She has a four year RN degree and is currently working at LaPorte Hospital and will be returning to school to be a nurse practitioner. She will be the nurse that will oversee the on-campus individual at the school.

6. Reports

6.01 Superintendent Report – A really good start to the school year and thanked everyone for making this a very smooth transition to the new school year. Mr. Bennett will be sending out dates to the Board to review to set a time for the budget workshop. ADM as of today is 496 with three students we send to Knox so that brings us up to 499. We are up about 20 students from last year at this time. Count day is September 16. Yesterday the Band and FFA participated in the Yellowstone Trail Festival Parade. The band sounds great. JMA will have a report to us in the next few days and will be on the agenda for the 12th of September. Thank you to Hensler's Nursery for letting us use their trailer for the band in the parade.

6.02 Principal's Report – Ms. Quinn reported on an opportunity for the Cheryl Welter Foundation radiothon that is coming up. She was approached by an anonymous donor that challenged the school to raise \$500 for this they will match that \$500 and a \$1000 donation will go to the radiothon in Oregon-Davis' name. There will be a Hat Day on Thursday and Jean Day on Friday. School picture day is Wednesday. No tech Tuesdays are in full swing. The playground had lines painted today. The book vending machine has had ist first couple of visitors this week. They were very excited. A shout out to all the teachers and staff at the elementary. The comments she has heard walking through the hallways have been very positive. Enrollment is up. Patronicity will start September 1.

Ms. DuVall reported on the newsletter that is going out to staff. She included a three question survey to the staff so they can reach out to staff members that need. Cell phone contract is going well with students. The students know what the consequences are before they happen. The FFA has pulled some of the elementary 4H members to participate in the livestock still a thon.

7. Board Comments

Mr. Nagai followed up on graduation items. He had a conversation with DOE and said some paperwork needs to be completed on a student that can be removed from our cohort which will

push our graduation rate up to 95%. Other items discussed were the pool scoreboard, elementary PE students in the pool, and utilization of the bus barn.

Mr. Minix echoed that he has heard nothing but positive statements about the start of the school year from kids and parents. The golf outing was Saturday, Nagai farms donated the hog and he appreciates all the donations. On the train track visibility issue, he had the county go out and the pushed the wrong tree down but they will take care of that. As far as the security questions he had, the corporation is still waiting for word on the grant. He asked how the air conditioning in the rest of the buildings. The elementary is warm and we are limping into winter with air conditioner.

Mr. Lady put on his parent hat and said he had received a phone call and voicemail from Ms. Quinn. His son had two rough days at preschool and the third day the call was to let him know that his son was doing a great job. It meant alot to him as a parent to get a call like that. Ms. Quinn tries to do that for anyone that needs it. Loved the three question survey from Ms. DuVall. He asked about nurse responsibilites. Mr. Bennett answered that she will review all state reports that are sent in, she wants to be as active as possible. She will be available for questions to the person on campus.

Ms. Ecker seconded Mr. Lady on the great idea of the three question survey.

Mr. Hinds has heard nothing but positives on the start of the school year.
